Independent Learning Time	<p>During Independent Learning Time, we are passionate in our belief that children learn through their own experiences and as such, have developed a curriculum which encourages exploration and discovery through sensory experiences. In the first three years of life, most children make sense of the world through their five senses. A sensory curriculum can involve playing with textures, ingredients, materials and props to stimulate the core senses and build children's awareness of using their senses. For example, playing in a sandpit develops a child's sense of touch – is the sand rough, smooth, dry, wet, hard, soft? This sensory information is passed from the body to the brain and is essential in helping children to make sense of the world around them, and is important for more complex learning tasks, language development, social interaction, gross motor skills and all types of future learning.</p>
