

Dear parents and carers

Thank you for your continued support during what has been a disrupted week due to the final two NEU strike days. We are incredibly **proud** of how Year 11 **engaged** with their Pre-Public Examinations (PPE's) this week. Year 10 will sit their PPE's alongside Year 11 next week and Years 7-9 will complete their end of cycle assessments in their lessons. This is the week for pupils to demonstrate how **ready** they are, and we wish them all the best of luck.

A reminder that Monday 27th March is a non-pupil day for the Secondary phase only. This day is planned so staff can mark assessments and plan for 'super teaching' week where learning will be focused on areas pupils have not secured their knowledge yet. Our 12 week learning cycles are based on Willingham's simple model of memory and they contain opportunities for regular knowledge retrieval which is spaced over time and supported by elaboration, interleaving, concrete examples and dual coding. 
