PRESCHOOL

This week in Pre-School, children have been completing their independent challenges including junk modelling to create props for our roleplay train station and garage, boats that they were then testing on the water trays and a Numberblocks challenge of separating the numicon into odds and evens. We also had some learning on how birds make nests and were watching videos of this. In PE we were doing different animal movements such as; crab, scorpion, and caterpillar.

In Phonics our sound is w. We were sounding out words like w-e-b web and w-i-g wig.

In Numberblocks learning we were learning about odds and evens, children were discussing how the evens were made of 2s and odds had an odd one on the top. Our Nursery Rhyme of the week is Down at the Station. Our Makaton Sign of the Week is bee.

RECEPTION

In Reception this week we have been busy writing all about our fun at the zoo. As well as continuing on with our instructions for growing a beanstalk. So far we haven't had many sprouting through, but fingers crossed with some sunshine, soon we will be seeing lots reaching for the sky. In our maths learning this week, we have been exploring 2D shape and talking about the names and properties of each shape. I wonder if your child can tell you about the ones we have been discussing (circle, square, rectangle, hexagon, pentagon and triangle). We have been getting stuck into our new story of Jack and the beanstalk this week and look forward to being further immersed in the story next week.

YEAR ONE

In Year 1 this week, the children have searched for light sources all around the school for Science. We counted 23 lights in just the downstairs corridors! In Geography, we learnt about different ancient Olympic sports and how they differ from todays. In English, we went for a walk to the Secondary Library and had a go at using prepositions to describe our journey. We have also observed different trainers in Art and had a go at sketching our favourite using different drawing techniques.

YEAR TWO

This week in Year 2 we have enjoyed learning more about Pre-Historic Britain. We discussed what it means for an animal to be extinct or extant, explored a selection of different animals and described these animals thinking carefully about what characteristics helped them to survive. In English we have continued to look at our book, Lord of the Forest, using alliteration and similes to describe different jungle animals.

YEAR THREE

This week in Year 3 we have been enjoying learning about the art created by Andy Goldsworthy. We have looked at how natural materials were used to sculpt and create special pieces in nature. The children looked at how to compare the different pieces whilst focusing on shading and hatching to share their own sketching skills. We plan to build on this and collect our own natural resources to enable us the create our very own masterpieces. In Maths we have moved onto Fractions and the children have enjoyed learning about unit fractions and making a whole. It has been so lovely to see the children talk about the use of fractions in everyday life.



YEAR FOUR

This week Year 4 have been exploring more of our new book Arthur and the Golden Rope and have been comparing it to other quest stories that they have read. In Science, we have been looking at how to stay safe around electricity and the children designed a poster all about it. In Music, we have been exploring pentatonic scales where in groups, the children came up with their own improvised pentatonic melody! It has been great to see that some children have already brought in Viking homework!

YEAR FIVE

We have had another great week in Year 5, finishing off our Fractions topic in Maths and now moving on to decimals and percentages. In English, we have been looking at perspective of writing and even writing our own version of a trial that Harry, Ron and Hermione faced in The Philosopher's Stone.

We have also been looking at Roman Exeter in History and learning more about why they decided to settle in Exeter.

In Art, we have been learning about blending and scrumming using oil pastels and creating a colour wheel to help us later on in the term when we will create our own piece of art.

YEAR SIX

This week children in year 6 have worked extremely hard continuing their revision for SATs and have spent time reflecting on practise questions. We continue to be proud of their effort and maturity during this preparation time. In PE, both classes have been working on team sports and techniques to support every player feel included. Children have had time to continue learning about the techniques used by David Hockney in Art and how he creates landscapes in a specific style. We have enjoyed using pastels to blend colours and create vivid patterns to experiment with style.
