WE ARE ANTI-BULLYING

As a Campus, we are consistently looking to improve both the prevention, and way in which we deal with, bullying incidents. Last year our Primary pupils trained up antibulling ambassadors through the Diana Award and this term we will be doing the same with Secondary pupils. We will also be working towards the Anti-Bullying Quality Mark (ABQM) which is a nationally recognised award for schools who have an effectively implemented anti-bullying process. This year we are going to be opening consultation on the way we deal with bullying for all stakeholders, and would like your involvement. We are looking for parents to join our steering group which currently involves Senior Leaders, teaching and non-teaching staff, pupils and governors. This small steering group will help to navigate how we work towards improving the way in which we identify, report and deal with bullying incidents. It will also look at the preventative measures we put in place as a Campus. As part of this, we will draft an anti-bullying policy which will replace our current anti-bullying statement: If you are interested in becoming part of the steering group, please fill out the google forms by Friday 22nd September. We are looking for one parent per key stage so if we have a lot of interest we can't guarantee a place. Please note if you would like to be involved in this steering group you may need to be available during the school day.

We have also enjoyed learning about our poem of the week - Fairy rings by Shakespeare, our song of the week - You're my best friend by Queen and our art of the week - Viva La Vida by Frida Kahlo.

In our English lessons this week, students have been creating exciting expanded noun phrases to describe dragons. For example, "the terrifying, murderous beast". We have been learning all about how technological advancement changed the lives of people living in Victorian England. The topic is linked closely with our Art focus - the artist L.S. Lowry.
