CONGRATULATIONS


During the summer break, Jackson from Favilli played 50 hours of football to raise money for FORCE cancer charity.

FIRE EVACUATION DRILL

On Wednesday 27th September 2023, we will be holding our first fire evacuation drill. We practice evacuating the building safely once per term so that pupils from all phases (Nursery, Primary and Secondary) are clear on what they need to do if there is ever the need to evacuate the building. We expect all pupils, staff and visitors to leave the building calmly and in silence when evacuating the building. Please do discuss this evacuation with your children so they are aware it is happening as it is the first drill of the academic year and lots of pupils will not have experienced our fire alarm and process before. During the Spring term, we will not inform you or pupils, however, we will inform staff so we can prepare for our most vulnerable pupils and adults.

In Nursery and Primary, pupils, staff and visitors leave via the nearest fire exit and then line up in the Primary multi use games areas (MUGA) at the front of the building for roll call.

In Secondary, pupils, staff and visitors leave via the nearest fire exit and then line up on the 3G pitch for roll call.

Once all pupils, staff and visitors are accounted for, pupils will be escorted by their teacher back to their classrooms.

LANGUAGE CLUB

In Language Club this week we decided that we are going to teach both Spanish and French across the next term. As an introduction we welcomed the children in Spanish and tasked them with making a poster illustrating their understanding of counting 1-10. IMPROVING COMMUNICATIONS BETWEEN SCHOOLS AND FAMILIES REGARDING SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Over the coming year, CEC is taking part in a research project called 'BITUP'. BITUP is a programme which aims to improve communications between schools and families regarding school attendance. It involves sending families regular updates about their children's recent attendance if it falls below 95%. The Children's Commissioner for England, Dame Rachel de Souza, has launched The Big Ambition, a national survey of children and young people across England. The Big Ambition is open to children and young people in England aged 0-18 years old. The Big Ambition aims to hear from children across England on what they think is important! In the lead up to the next General Election, the Children's Commissioner wants to take children's thoughts, opinions and ideas to decision-makers, to make sure that the Government hears young people's voices on what they think needs to be done to make children's lives better in England.

In addition to meeting, we will establish some form of online group (eg WhatsApp) for the duration of consultation, to allow group discussion outside the meetings.

PARENTS QUESTIONS

Tuesday made me so proud as I witnessed numerous families visiting our campus to meet our wonderful teachers. Alongside learning about the diverse range of educational opportunities awaiting our pupils this year, families who attended also had the chance to pose questions. FAQs from the evening included:

Question 1: Which homework should we prioritise?

Answer: All children should engage in daily reading, either independently or with a family member or trusted adult, and document their daily home reading on Boom Reader. Sparx homework should also be completed, with additional opportunities available for children to do so at school. Homework Grids are provided for those who are curious and eager to explore various subjects as part of their home learning. Any completed Homework Grids brought into school will be celebrated and rewarded with house points.

Question 2: What is the school's approach to anti-bullying?

Answer: Bullying is defined as deliberate, hurtful behaviour that is repeated over time and makes it difficult for those being targeted to defend themselves. The four primary types of bullying include physical, verbal, indirect, and cyberbullying. We strongly encourage all children to report any issues they may encounter at school or at home, whether it pertains to bullying, cyberbullying, home-related concerns, or worries about fellow pupils. Students can report these issues in person or via email at safespace@cranbrook.education.

This year, CEC is collaborating with the University of Exeter to monitor our students' confidence in anti-bullying strategies and approaches. Additionally, we've established an Anti-Bullying Ambassadors group to empower students to take a leading role in addressing this issue. Furthermore, we are actively working towards obtaining an Anti-Bullying Quality Mark, which includes engaging with our families, listening to your ideas, suggestions, and concerns, and working collaboratively to provide support. Senior Leaders look forward to reporting more on this throughout the year.

Question 3: Will any pupils attend swimming lessons this year?

Answer: Swimming lessons will commence for Year 5 pupils in Term 2, starting this January, and the Swimming Pool location will be shifting to Honiton, our nearest and preferred option. Stay tuned for more details regarding Year 5 swimming in Half Term 2.

Question 4: Do Year 3 students have a sleepover at CEC?

Answer: The Year 3 Sleepover is more of a late-night event with a sleepover atmosphere. It offers students a fun opportunity to experience school life late into the night, featuring movie watching and enjoyable company, though pickup will be before bedtime! RECEPTION

What a wonderful week in Reception! This week in English the children have demonstrated excellent recall of our key text 'A Hug for Humphrey' and were able to identify various characters within the story. Our focus during Maths this week has been counting and we had a very interesting class discussion about whether size or colour affect how many you have. YEAR ONE



YEAR TWO


We have had another very positive week in Year 2. It was lovely to meet so many families at our 'Meet the Teacher' event on Tuesday. In class, we have been finishing our unit on numbers to 100. Well done and thank you to all children who have completed their SPARX homework. In English, we have finished writing about 'The Train Ride' and the children have written some excellent final pieces. In science, the children learned about the importance of wearing a helmet when riding a bike. In art, we started to look at some more William Morris designs and discussed what we liked about each of them.

YEAR THREE & FOUR

In Year 3 and 4 this week, we have been getting to grips with a new topic in Science, understanding more about different types of rock. Many of the children loved finding out the difference between Igneous, Sedimentary and Metamorphic rock! We created our own fact files to support our understanding. In English we have been continuing our work around postcard writing and have researched different types of bear to write about in next weeks shared write which includes our animal going on a journey. We have received some wonderful examples of home learning so far including funky raps, spelt bread making and postcards to Roman Emperors.







The children have been working hard to focus on their PERKS and earn themselves house points! Our first bronze awards for the year have been earnt this week! YEAR 5

This week in Year 5, we have continued learning about the solar system in science, looking at how far each planet is from the Sun, the children were amazed! In maths we have moved on to place value to 1,000,000! In English, we held a press conference and the children gathered quotes that they will use in their newspaper articles. In Art, we designed our own Benin Kingdom tiles, the children worked really hard to pick out details from the examples that we have been looking at and we are really proud of the effort that they have put into their designs!

YEAR SIX

In Year 6 this week, we have been writing formal letters to Miss Gandhi asking for permission to go on a dragon-hunting school trip. We are eagerly awaiting a response with crossed fingers. This has been the first piece of published writing in Year 6 and Miss Shelbourne has been really impressed with the effort students have put in to their work. In Maths lessons, the children have been focused on solving problems using the four operations: division, multiplication, addition and subtraction. They have been able to show off different strategies when problem solving. In RE, our topic this half term in Hinduism. Students have learnt all about reincarnation and the principle beliefs of the religion.


