
LANGUAGE CLUB



NURSERY

This week in Carle Class we have been exploring lots of colourful paint and using cardboard rolls to create some beautiful firework pictures. PRESCHOOL

Wow what an exciting first week back in Preschool. Its been lovely to hear all about your exciting holiday adventures, as well as firework and bonfire excursions. We have been busy exploring how to make our own firework pictures. We have also made some beautiful poppy pictures for Remembrance. Our Rhyme of the week has been Hey Diddle Diddle and we have enjoyed singing it with actions. We have had fun playing with rhyming words and counting syllables in our classroom to develop our learning of rhythm and rhyme. Each class had a star hanging from the ceiling and the children were very engaged when working as a team to try and build a tall enough structure to reach it! In Maths we have continued to focus on 2D shapes and being able to identify the similarities and differences between them. In our Creative Area the children have been busy designing their own firework picture using a mixture of resources. Thank you to all parents and carers who attended the Pupil Wellbeing Evenings, it was lovely to be able to share your child's achievements with you and let you know how your child has settled into class. We hope you have brilliant weekend and we look forward to seeing you next week!

YEAR 1

Year 1 have had a #Crantastic first full week back. Our new English book Oi Frog! has everyone engaged and we have been challenging ourselves to come up with the silliest rhyme! In Maths we have continued to work hard on our number bonds to 10 and it is brilliant to see how confident the children are becoming within this. Our new Science topic this half term is Who Am I? where we have been looking at the parts of the body and our senses. We thoroughly enjoyed labelling parts of our bodies and our first experiment where we explored our sense of smell. Most children described the strong garlic smell as disgusting!



YEAR 2

What a great first week back into year 2! This week in English, we started learning about our new story: 'Could a penguin ride a bike?' and we found it very funny! In maths, we continued our addition and subtraction learning but moved on to adding and subtracting two digit numbers! In science, we began exploring mini-worlds to prepare us for the trip to the country park on Tuesday! In geography, we began learning about our world and have started singing the continents song. We have also welcomed two new members of our team, Mr Nick Knight who is based in Ellis class and Miss Lucia Bergamasco who is based in Engle class. YEAR 3 & 4

In years 3 and 4 this week, we have had a lovely start to the term with the children being ready and engaged across our phase. Many of the children have been proud to show their home learning they have started.

As teachers, we have enjoyed speaking with parents about how children have settled into their new classes for this year, things we'd like each child to work on and positive moments so far. Thank you to all who attended.

We are thrilled to share that we have an exciting opportunity across our phase to learn the ukulele in Music! This is something Ibtihaj class shall be starting next week and all other classes shall then have this opportunity later in the year. On the subject of Music, we have also chosen our Christmas songs for the phase this year and shall be asking children to practise these at home.

Across our phase we are trailing using booklets to complete our work in Geography. We asked the children for their feedback and it seems they have really enjoyed their first lessons and felt excited to see what comes next. Did you know that the oceans hold 97% of the earths waters!?

YEAR 5

year 5 have had a very busy week in school! We have finished our maths topic, graphs and tables, and started our new topic, multiplication and division. In English, we have been learning about the use of descriptive language, creating our own descriptions of characters from our book Beowulf. Children have created poems, drawings and letters to pay their respect to service people past and present.





Intercom Trust are now taking referrals for our new project Family Pride South West.

The project has 4 components;

*Family Pride Events – fun family events for families where at least one member is LGBT+

*Parenting Support – We will be delivering Group Triple P for LGBT+ parents/carers with children between the ages of 2 and 12. This will be an 8 week course focussing on parenting skills.

*Family Relationship Support – Our family practitioners can work with families where there is tension or communication problems between parents (together or apart). This can include disagreements on how best to support an LGBT+ child in the family, or where a parent has come out as LGBT+ and they are unsure what this means for their relationship, as well as more general relationship difficulties.

*Couples/co-parent counselling – We will have counselling available for parents who wish to work through difficulties in a therapeutic setting.
