Dear CEC families

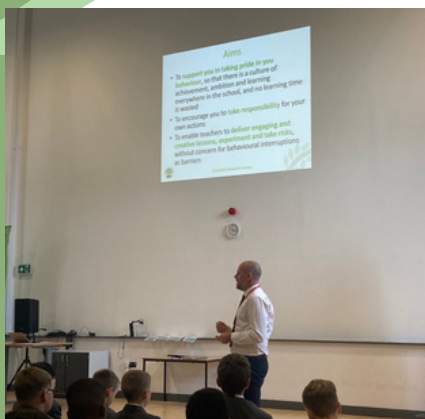
Welcome back! It has been lovely to welcome our Secondary pupils back to the Campus this week. We have had a very busy and successful week. To aid with your busy schedules, I have summarised the key points below, however, there are also more updates within this weekly newsletter, so please do take 10 minutes to read and discuss this newsletter with your children.

- **Trust Collaboration day** (last week but worth mentioning) - All staff from across Ted Wragg Trust took part in focused training and workshop sessions aimed at supporting them to grow and be better for your children. We hosted over 600 staff across 24 different sessions at CEC. The staff from our other schools really enjoyed spending time at the Campus.
- **INSET** - On Thursday and Friday, our Secondary staff team continued to focus on improvements with a range of on-site sessions focusing on our key priorities which include:
 - High expectations
 - Habits for learning
 - Disciplinary literacy - Oracy (Voice 21)
 - Our core offer
 - Planning for all
- **Town centre consultation.** On Tuesday, we hosted Ash Futures consultation and Thea Billeter from East Devon planning to capture the views of our pupils regarding the town centre consultation. Pupils really engaged with the consultation and made their views very clear on what they want from the town centre.
- **Period 6 (Year 11).** On Wednesday, our Year 11 pupils attended their first targeted Period 6 lesson with a specific focus on English and Maths. Attendance and engagement was excellent and we are confident that these additional lessons will support our Year 11 pupils to secure excellent outcomes in their GCSE's.
- **Remembrance. Today, at 11am,** Ms Alex Hawkins played the last post on her bugle to honour armed forces members who have died in the line of duty. Ms Hawkins played this from the main atrium and we also live streamed into all our classrooms.
- **Homework reminder.** A reminder that we have changed our homework catch up system. If your child did not complete any of their homework tasks this week, they will be expected to attend a 2 hour (15:00-17:00) support session on Monday in Mr Archer's classroom. You will have received a message from MCAS about this if it affects your child.
- **#Makeanoise for anti-bullying week.** Next week is #antibullyingweek and we have events happening every day. Please find the full schedule within.

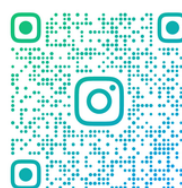

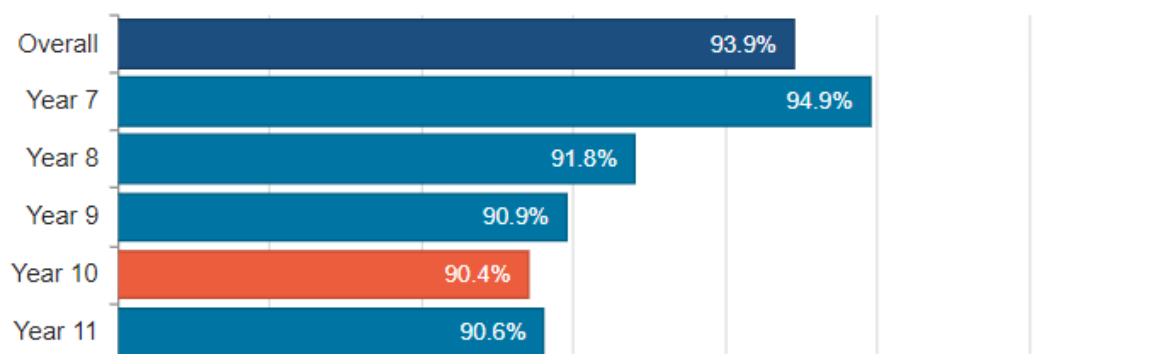

Intercom Trust are now taking referrals for our new project Family Pride South West.

The project has 4 components;

*Family Pride Events – fun family events for families where at least one member is LGBT+



*Parenting Support – We will be delivering Group Triple P for LGBT+ parents/carers with children between the ages of 2 and 12. This will be an 8 week course focussing on parenting skills.

*Family Relationship Support – Our family practitioners can work with families where there is tension or communication problems between parents (together or apart). This can include disagreements on how best to support an LGBT+ child in the family, or where a parent has come out as LGBT+ and they are unsure what this means for their relationship, as well as more general relationship difficulties.

*Couples/co-parent counselling – We will have counselling available for parents who wish to work through difficulties in a therapeutic setting.
