

Dear CEC families

As we end another week and I reflect on the week to write this newsletter, I feel real pride in our pupils, staff and community. This pride comes from the key areas below:

- #makeanoise for anti-bullying This week we really have made a noise for anti-bullying. We started the week by wearing odd socks, made banners on Tuesday, held an information event/protest on Wednesday outside of school at the end of the day, made our pledges on Thursday and held drop in sessions on Friday. This week-long campaign highlights that we do not tolerate bullying at the Campus and we are working hard to ensure that all incidents of bullying are followed up and dealt with appropriately.
- Drama monologues Yesterday, our Year 10 BTEC Drama pupils performed their monologues publicly to their families and members of the CEC staff body. They did a brilliant job and we are super proud of them all.
- Homework Thank you to the 90+% of families who continue to support us with our meaningful, impactful and appropriate independent study (homework) to support classroom learning and development of pupil self-study skills. We are currently ranked as:
 - 4th out of 288 schools in Sparx Reader
 - 87th out of 2,099 schools in Sparx Maths
- Donations THANK YOU for your generous donations to support both our 'winter warmth' and 'holiday gift' appeals. Our families in need are very lucky to have such an amazing and supportive community.
- Pupil Parliament PE kit on PE days Last night, we were joined by our pupil
 parliament cabinet ministers at our senior leadership meeting. They clearly
 presented their proposal to move back to PE kit on PE days. The team presented so
 clearly and were clear about the positives and negatives of each system. We have
 agreed to trial moving back to PE kit on PE day from Monday 27th November. We
 will communicate with you as families separately about this and will be informing
 pupils of the expectations via tutor time next week.





Intercom Trust are now taking referrals for our new project
Family Pride South West.

The project has 4 components;

*Family Pride Events – fun family events for families where at least one member is LGBT+



*Parenting Support – We will be delivering Group Triple P for LGBT+ parents/carers with children between the ages of 2 and 12. This will be an 8 week course focussing on parenting skills.

*Family Relationship Support – Our family practitioners can work with families where there is tension or communication problems between parents (together or apart). This can include disagreements on how best to support an LGBT+ child in the family, or where a parent has come out as LGBT+ and they are unsure what this means for their relationship, as well as more general relationship difficulties.

*Couples/co-parent counselling – We will have counselling available for parents who wish to work through difficulties in a therapeutic setting.
