Trust Review statements

We received our full report from our Ted Wragg Trust review last week and we are delighted to announce that the team identified 41 strengths across the Campus, plus some areas for development. We will share a couple of these each week for the coming weeks with you all.

- There is a warm and positive culture across the campus. The PERKS values are central to all that leaders do, starting with their inclusion in the recruitment process. Staff and pupils articulate PERKS consistently well and they are increasingly being lived by all.
- Consistencies in retrieval practice are resulting in pupils being able to recall their current and prior knowledge, some with detailed knowledge from memory.

- In most lessons, visualisers are used well to model and reinforce prior and current learning. They were used particularly well in Year 10 English lessons where teachers not only modelled the learning but also held pupils to account by targeting questions and fostering a dialogue about the key learning points.
- The use of the Cranbrook booklets in key curriculum areas is also assisting in pupils' building of knowledge and establishing working routines, such as note taking and using reference materials.


