#### Primary Update - 15th March 2024

Dear CEC Families,

I'm writing this before our PTA Red Nose Day Disco which I'm sure will be a joyous evening filled with dancing, treats and lots of fun.

A massive thanks to the PTA for organising this for our young community, and to our staff who attend and support the event.

As mentioned last week, we will continue to be celebrating the strengths shared in our recent Trust Review. This week, I want to

draw our attention to our increasingly warm and welcoming culture. The reviewers themselves noted:

'Pupils display respect for difference and the role they play in crafting a welcoming culture for all.

They feel well supported due to the strong pastoral systems and the broad range of adults to whom they can refer any worries. End of day appreciations and assemblies also contribute to the enhancement of pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development.'

This week, I've selected this statement because it resonates deeply with my observations on the ground. We've had the privilege of hosting four visitors at our school, who were treated to a pupil-led tour guided by Anabel, Ian, Willow, and Jacob from Year 6, along with Ayda from Year 3. These pupils confidently showcased our school's offerings with genuine love, warmth, and joy. Our CEC Staff Chaperones were truly impressed, remarking that these pupils exhibited remarkable manners and articulate communication skills. They described the tours as incredible, praising our young tour leaders for celebrating everything that makes CEC exceptional.



As we continue to promote important British values as part of pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural (SMSC) development offer, this week our teaching staff received training from the London-based organisation You Be You. We are proud to be the first school in the South West to receive

You Be You training and this on key themes centered around diversity, equity and inclusion. The session empowered us, as a team, to consider how we can better reflect our community within our curriculum. We are in the early stages of our work with You Be You and look forward to keeping our families updated and involved in our work in this space.







This week, I have also continued the recruitment process for our Deputy Headteacher (Quality of Education) role for next academic year. As I have been visiting candidates in their own schools to observe their teaching and leadership in a setting where they have already built strong relationships, I haven't been on mornings gates as much as I'd like. 

#### **Year Group Updates**

#### **Nursery Update**

This week in Carle Class we have turned our home corner into a garden, the children have been enjoying exploring the pots, scoops and colourful flowers to create their flower creations. We have also been sending home all sunflowers that have been planted and have loved seeing how they have grown already, we will let you know the date for the final photo of your grown sunflower to see who I the winner. We have also been enjoying our book of the week 'What's in the garden', the children have talked about what they can see throughout the book.



#### **Preschool Update**

This week in Preschool we have been focusing more on how to grow plants and have also enjoyed learning about Ramadan and completing Ramadan-inspired activities. This is the first week of Ramadan and the children have been linking the Islam holiday meaning of peace and kindness to their everyday activities. We are still looking at 'The Enormous Turnip' and looking closer into how to work as a team and the benefits of teamwork. In Maths, we have been recapping our number bonds to 5 with a ladybird spot-counting activity and revisiting the Numberblocks episode 'Hide and Seek'. In Rhyme time, we have revisited one of our favourite rhymes '1, 2, 3, 4, 5, Once I caught a fish alive' and the children have loved adding Makaton actions when singing as well as exploring the sounds and rhymes. Have a lovely weekend and we'll see you next week when we start our final book focus for this term!

#### **Reception Update**

Reception have been super learners this week! They have demonstrated the perks of being Crantastic, including being proud and engaged. In English this week the children have sequenced and written captions about the Very Hungry Caterpillar. They were excellent at using their grapheme mat to find the needed sounds, and are beginning to use finger spaces. We had such an exciting time at Forest School on Wednesday! The children loved having warm and gooey smores around a camp fire with Mr Knight. They listened brilliantly and stayed safe. In Maths this week we

#### **Year Two Update**

#### **Year Five Update**

This week in year 5 we have seen the children really persevere with their maths and reading test papers. They all showed a huge amount of focus and determination during the tests, we are very proud of them! We had a brilliant trip to the swimming pool on Wednesday, the children continue to make so much progress and have really developed their confidence in the swimming pool. Just a reminder that the last swimming lesson will be on **Wednesday 27th March**. In DT this week, we have been looking at the stability of different shapes, the children found that a triangle was the most stable shape. We also learnt about the Savannah in Geography, the children enjoyed learning about all of the different animals which inhabit the Savannah. Have a brilliant weekend!

#### **Year Six Update**

This week in year 6 has been been another busy one. In maths, children have been calculating the area and perimeter of quadrilaterals and solving complex problems using this skill. Children have increased their speed and accuracy in arithmetic using LbQ. Well done to those children who have engaged with this at home too - we are very proud. In science, Year 6 have been learning about the process of fossilisation and how key evolutionary evidence has been preserved and discovered. Next week we will be undertaking another set of mock SATs tests to help prepare children for the real tests that will commence between Monday 13th - Thursday 16th May. 
#### Join us for Cranbrook's first colour run!
