As we come into our final week of Spring term, I encourage full attendance from Monday to Thursday for all pupils. Every day is vital for learning and when pupils miss time at school this reduces receiving high-quality instruction from our teaching team, and can impact academic achievement as well as sense of belonging. We have a jam packed week coming up with ambitious learning and lots of fun too. I look forward to seeing every Primary pupil on campus and **ready** to learn.

Lock-down practice

Next Wednesday (27th) afternoon, we will be holding a lock-down practice. During this practice, the lock-down alarm will sound which is a long continuous sound – this makes it easy to distinguish from the fire alarm. We will stop the alarm after 1 minute but this will give pupils chance to know the difference. During the lock-down practice, pupils and staff will be expected to stay in their classes and lock the doors. Senior leaders will walk the corridors and usher any children who are in the corridors or in the bathroom to the nearest office or classroom. Senior leaders will then go to each classroom to inform pupils and staff that the practice is over. Please do discuss this lock-down practice with your children so they are aware it is happening and they can prepare and thank you for your support.

Pupil survey celebrations

Last week, Head of Campus, Stephen Farmer, and Head of Primary, Krisha Gandhi, met with Executive Leaders within our Ted Wragg Trust to analyse our recent pupil survey data. The feedback from this survey is so important as it reflects the voice and experiences of our pupils, and is a valuable insight into the our school offer from a pupil perspective. We are pleased to share three areas our campus is excelling in from our pupils' perspective:

- Our culture of reading. Being asked to read across varying subjects by all teachers is a reflection of our commitment to reading to support learning.
- Our commitment to valuing pupil voice. Our Pupil Parliament plays a vital role in decision
 making within the school and are often consulted with on key decisions for example, when
 choosing our school lunch providers. We are proud to have a number of other opportunities
 for Pupil Voice through our other pupil leader groups such as Anti-Bullying Ambassadors. Our
 pupils' requests have also been actioned where appropriate such as Rainbow Buddy Benches
 in the playground and Secondary wearing PE Kit on PE Days.

Our fair treatment of pupils by staff - Over the past few years, a focus for our campus, across Primary and Secondary, has been developing a consistent approach to how we support pupils - both in learning and behaviour. No matter which classroom they are learning in, pupils should know what to expect. We recruit staff who share our values and train our team weekly so that, in all classrooms, pupils feel supported with best practice, ambitious aspirations and high expectations. Since our pupil survey results last year, we have also been working on sharing the reasons behind decisions to promote transparency and understanding with pupils. We are really pleased to see pupils recognise this as a culture of fairness across our campus.

Nursery Update

Preschool Update

This week in Preschool we have loved learning about the life of bees which has us all ready for Spring! We have enjoyed looking closer at pollen and nectar as well as planting flowers and herbs in the garden tool. Looking more into how hees make honey we have been exploring the parts of a

flower too and seeing where the bees get the pollen from. After being so inspired by our new story, we decided to make a class bee hotel so that we can make sure the bees get a good rest. We have been using our vegetable knowledge from the past 2 weeks to help us create ABAB and ABCABC (for example pear, carrot, pear, carrot) patterns in Maths. The children have loved finding different objects to make different patterns with. In the garden this week, we have enjoyed setting up a car wash and washing all of the cars, bikes and scooters. In Rhyme time, we are once again revisiting an old favourite, 'Baa Baa Black Sheep' where the children have been exploring the sounds linked to the rhyme and learning about the rhyming words. Thank you to all of the grown-ups who attended our Pupil Progress and Wellbeing meetings. We enjoyed sharing how well your children are doing and the next steps in their learning journey! We hope you have a wonderful weekend and we can't wait for our last week of #Crantastic learning before the holidays!



Reception Update

We have had such a brilliant week in Reception! To start the week off, we had a very special delivery from Mrs Partridge containing a letter, a wrapped parcel, an egg and a seed. After reading the letter, the children were tasked with predicting what the egg and seed might grow into. This led to many fascinating discussions about various life cycles and the children thrived when sharing their knowledge with their peers. Our new text is called 'Pip and Egg' written by Alex Latimer and David Litchfield. In Maths the children have thoroughly enjoyed learning about and creating various patterns. They learnt that repeating patterns can be created using alternating colours, sizes, and even sounds! On Wednesday the

children got to plant their very own seed! The children found out all about what plants need to grow and the life cycle of a plant. They very excitedly planted their seed and cannot wait to look after it and observe the changes over time. Year One Update

Year one have yet again been making the most of every opportunity to learn. We have been finding out all about tigers as a means of exploring the structure of a non-fiction text. We have been absolutely loving our maths work based on weight and measure - exploring the difference between non standard and standard units. In geography we have been thinking carefully about the improvements we could make to our local area and have put lots of thought into the design of a band new play park for Cranbrook. It has been lovely meeting our fantastic parents and carers for progress meetings this week - thank you so much for your continued support. Well done year one. Whoosh!


Year Two Update

We have been working hard on learning more facts about the rainforest. This has helped us in drafting and writing up a letter as if they were an animal from the rainforest explaining what we love about the rainforest and what is going wrong (deforestation). The children really enjoyed this. In maths we have been working on what is the most efficient method in solving maths problems. In science we looked at what force (push/pull) would be needed to stretch, squeeze, twist and bend objects, the children enjoyed hands on experience of squeezing, stretching etc items!


Year Three & Four Update


In maths, Year 4 the children have been continuing their learning of decimals and understanding what they look like as both decimals and fractions. Year 3 the children have been continuing their learning of fractions looking at equivalent fractions.



In Science the children are coming to the end of the unit and have learnt lots about plants. They will have also taken their own sunflowers home and they have a challenge in each class to grow the tallest sunflower plant. Year Five Update

Year 5 have had a busy week getting prepared for their class assemblies next week, the children are excited to show you all of their learning!

We had a great afternoon swimming on Wednesday and the children are sad that next week (27th March) will be their last swimming lesson this year. We are so proud of their progress and the effort that they have been putting in!

In maths, we have been learning about decimals, writing decimals as fractions and learning about tenths, hundredths and thousandths. In Geography, we have started to write our essays, all about Earth's Biomes.

Year Six Update

This week in Year 6 children have been undertaking another set of mock SATs exams in preparation for their May assessments. We are very proud of their continued focus and

for each other. Well done, everyone! We will be offering additional revision sessions after the Easter break to ensure everyone feels as prepared as possible. We are blown away by children's positive outlook and resilience in preparation for this and their transition to Year 7. In PE they have been improving their tennis skills and we have observed some exciting rallies (some backhands too). Geography has led us to researching the history of the census and how this has helped to monitor and document population changes in the UK. Children created class graphs using the data based on how many people live in each of their households. 
Join us for Cranbrook's first colour run!


