

Year Group Updates

Preschool Update

Preschool have had an exciting week with visits from an ambulance and a police car! The children had the opportunity to ask lots of questions and even go inside the ambulance! The paramedics demonstrated how to use the stretcher with one of the children lying down on it pretending to be a patient and we were able to see some of the children's heart beats on the defibrillator monitor. Alongside this we have been learning about other occupations such as being a dentist in our rolehave drawn on our playground. Please could we have any photos of people in your family at work to share with the class? We are especially looking for any occupations from older generations so we can compare their jobs to modern day jobs.

This week in maths we have been exploring 3D shapes and how their sides can look like 2D shapes. for example a rectangle on the side of a cuboid. Can you spot any 2D or 3D shapes at home with your child?

Reception Update

This week in Reception we have had a big focus on People Who Help Us. The children have absolutely loved dressing up and taking on the role of Policemen, Paramedics, Mechanics and more! On Tuesday we had a visit from the South Western Ambulance service. They informed the children all about their job, what they do and how they help people. The children were extremely engaged, even asking



questions to further their understanding. Afterwards they got to go inside the ambulance and see all of the different features! We also had a visit from Police Officers on Friday who shared with the children how they help people and keep everybody safe. It was brilliant for the children to hear about all that they do, not just putting 'baddies' into jail! In Maths we have been busy counting back using various strategies including using a number line and using our fingers. We have learnt that we do not count the number that we start on. The children have impressed their teachers when writing sentences about Mr Gumpy's Motor car. They were able to use language from the text and remember the main parts brilliantly. Year One Update

Let's go year one! We are all working super-hard. Traction Man has been a big hit - we are describing character this week and getting ready for getting into role next week. As a reminder - We ask that children come to school on **Wednesday 1st May** in bright coloured clothes (ones that you don't mind getting a little messy) so we can transform each child into their own superhero action figure in preparation for our writing later on in the topic. We have been sorting light sources in science and honing our ball skills in tennis. Lots of doubling and skip counting in maths, so any opportunity to practice counting in 2's, 5's and 10's at home would be fab. Well done year one!

Year Two Update

This week in maths we have been working hard on fractions learning about half and a quarter of an amount, also a quarter and three quarters of a shape.

In English, we have learnt about how to use a possessive apostrophes and how to use imperative verbs within our writing.

The children in science enjoyed planting their sunflower seeds and we look forward to seeing them grow over the next few weeks.

In our PE sessions children are learning the skills to control a tennis ball on a racket and bouncing the ball and trying to catch it on the racket.

The children are reading so well in our reading practise sessions and hopefully you can hear a real difference in their reading at home.

Year Three & Four Update

In Year 3 and 4 this week we have been having a lovely time getting back into routine showing our teachers how proud we are to be a part of CEC. May children have been awarded their Platinum house point certificates which is such an achievement. We have been learning skills in rounders around, throwing, catching and batting. The children are showing great maturity around being team players and are improving with their listening skills.

We have seen great work come through for home learning including Lego models and oat cakes. We hope you all have a wonderful weekend and enjoy your family time.



Year 5 have had a brilliant week this week! We enjoyed our kick boxing lesson on Wednesday, where we were working on a combination. In English, we have been creating our independent writes based on the story 'Harry Potter and the Philosophers Stone' - the children have enjoyed the challenge of coming up with their own tasks and magical objects. In maths, we have been continuing to learn about decimals, focussing on adding and subtracting. In Science we have been exploring different scientists, including Alexander Fleming and Marie Curie. 

Congratulations to Nyla Rattenberry in year 5, who has been on stage giving it her all with the Gang Show this year. We are so proud of you Nyla.




Community Notice Board
