Happy New Year. We hope you all had a lovely Christmas break. It has been a busy first week back and we are Proud of how well pupils have Engaged with being back in school.

These sessions will increase the probability of exam success and support Year 11 pupils to improve their life chances.

Year 10 and Year 11 pupils were also treated to a special Apprenticeship's assembly yesterday which introduces pupils to apprenticeships and what can be offered. There will be a follow-up workshop on the 20th January for up to 25 pupils who are keen to pursue apprenticeships when they leave CEC.

Next week we have our external Trust review of the Primary phase on Monday and Tuesday, and it is Year 11 parents/carers evening on Thursday. We will be sending out a new Trust wide parent/carer survey to collect your feedback on how we can further improve so please do take the time to complete this and help us become the best school in the UK.

She discussed the benefits of apprenticeships with all year 10 and 11 pupils and will be running a further workshop session on Friday 20th January for those year 11's who may want support applying. All of year 11 will also be attending a trip to the University of Plymouth on Tuesday 17th January to see what University life is like. A letter has already gone out to year 11 parents and a reminder email will be sent next week.

Year 10 will start to be looking at applications for their Summer work experience placement in the next few weeks. If you are a year 10 parent, it would be a really good opportunity to talk to them about what sector they would like experience in before the end of the month.

Some pupils in year 10 have also signed up to complete the Young Enterprise challenge this year run by Mr Kelly and Aynsley Jones at our EX5-Alive community hub. More information on this will be sent out as they continue their journey.

Additional SEN career support. Did you know all pupils who have an EHCP in year 9, 10 and 11 will be offered a 1-2-1 careers guidance appointment every academic year until they leave school. This will be run by an external company who are qualified in giving careers advice.
