SCIENCE CLUB

Human beings are pretty smart. We have transformed the world and thought up wonderous inventions. But what will the future hold for planet earth and the people who inhabit it? Can we use innovative technology to improve the quality of our lives as well as the world we live in? Can we live smarter?

In second challenge of this half term's theme, the science club looked at how the human addiction to oil means that vast quantities of it are transported across some of the roughest seas on the planet. Accidents are inevitable, so they tested absorbent booms designed to contain and absorb the escaped oil before it can harm ecosystems or livelihoods. Then they tested the effect of dispersants on oil slicks, simulating a storm at sea.


