This Friday, we were visited by a member of Devon and Somerset Fire Service who delivered workshops to our children in year 5 and year 2 on Fire Safety. The children were very engaged and asked good questions throughout!

ONLINE SAFETY

This month at CEC we have been exploring being safe and healthy.

Whilst we often think about being safe and healthy physically and mentally too, keeping safe online is an important aspect of 21st century life.

If your children are online - be it playing games, on social media or simply for homework use - then it's important that we talk to them about being kind in the digital space. This includes being careful about where comments are posted, commenting positively and kindly if a comment is being made, and not saying things online that we wouldn't and shouldn't say face to face. At school, we have and will continue to speak to children about the golden rule of treating others as they would expect to be treated themselves, and it is important that this message is reiterated at home and for online interactions too.

Your child also needs to be aware that what they see online isn't always the full reality. Be it using online filters or people adopting the use of avatars, in digital conversations, we cannot always be confident in knowing who is behind the other screen. It's therefore important that your younger children are with an adult when using the internet and know who they should talk to if anything unusual occurs. Likewise, please do explore with your older children how to block and report any behaviour that is inappropriate.







BUBBLES

MCAS

In September we moved our MIS system to Bromcom which comes with an integrated communications portal for parents to have a digital link to the school. We are excited to announce that we are ready to start the release of this program and will be releasing details a year group at a time.

You will shortly receive a link to My Child at School which will allow you to log in via a computer or smart device to update your child's details as well as your own personal details. You will also be able to update/amend any Medical or Dietary requirements for your child so that as a school we can keep our MIS system as up to date as possible.

Within the system it also holds a chat function where you can send a direct message to the school. (For example, if someone else is collecting your child or they had a bad night etc)
There is so much more available that the system will be able to do moving forward but these are the first things that will be available to you. This is going to have a positive impact on us as a school as it will streamline our communications allowing you as parents to have easier access to amendments that need to be made about your child.

Once you have received your link to the system please have go at logging in and setting up your account. The software can be used via the internet or you can download the MyChildatSchool App.

YEAR UPDATES RECEPTION


We have been busy in Reception this week learning all about sentences in Literacy. We have practiced writing simple sentences using finger spaces, capital letters and full stops. In phonics we have been learning some new diagraphs and even a trigraph. Ask us what that is if you're not sure, we are amazing at remembering the difference. In maths we have been using tens frames and continuing to look at whole part models, so we can build up different ways of looking at numbers, and beginning to make number sentences. We have been building pirate junk, staining our treasure maps with tea (so they look old) and even making pirate ships in the construction during our busy independent learning. We look forward to exploring floating and sinking next week!

YEAR ONE

Year 1 have been very busy this week comparing everyday objects from Ancient Egypt to the items we have today. We discovered that the pillows we have today are much comfier than the ones they had in ancient Egypt! Our fridges and toilets are also much better than the ones they had too. In science, we have been investigating the best way to insulate a frozen bottle so that it doesn't melt. In English we have continued looking at Snow White and have been describing the ways in which Snow White and the evil queen move. There has been a lot of work

going onto the #Crantastic wall! In computing, we have used beebots to record algorithms to find ancient treasure and travel along different shapes. It was quite tricky to program the beebots to move along the zigzags!





YEAR TWO & THREE

Another full pack and exciting week has been happening in Year 2 and 3.

We have continued with are English work starting to create our own versions of the Dragon machine story.

In maths we have been continuing to explore multiplication and division, with the children gaining more confidence in their 3, 4 and 8 times tables.

The highlight this week was having the amazing opportunity of visiting the Science laboratories to use the microscopes as part of our materials topic. They looked at lots of different materials under the microscopes ranging from cloth to biscuit crumbs to germs. There are some budding scientists for the future among us. We hope to be able to visit the secondary science laboratories again in the future.

In history we have been delving further into the Shang Dynasty and have now explored a little more about who led it and what life was like for people living at this time.









YEAR FOUR

This week Year 4 have been building the skills they need to write their alternative traditional tale in the next couple of weeks. The children have been very enthusiastic about this and their creative ideas have been amazing! In Maths, we have moved onto division and using this knowledge, as well as their knowledge of multiplication, to help them solve problems. In Art, we have been looking at tie-dye and how the Anglo-Saxons used this to dye their own clothes. In Computing, the children listened to and recorded their own mini podcast! The children are looking forward to their trip to Escot in a couple weeks time!


YEAR FIVE
