#### YEAR UPDATES

#### **NURSERY**

We have had a great first week back after half term, we hope you all had a lovely break.

Our rhyme of the term is 'Humpty Dumpty' this week we have made our very own Humpty Dumpty's to put on our lovely display, we have used lots of different styles of hair, eyes, clothes to make our creations. We have also been creating our very own Humpty Dumpty's using pink play dough using pipe cleaners and Pom poms. Our rhyme of the week is 'Little Peter Rabbit' we have made rabbit ears to wear at circle time to sing our 'Peter Rabbit' song.

#### **PRESCHOOL**

This week children were immersed in their new topic Dinosaurs. Children visited the library on Tuesday and Friday, to enjoy a story as a group, look at books individually but also to borrow some lovely dinosaur books for our classroom. We had PE on Tuesday and Friday but have also been playing lots of games throughout the week. Children have been drawing dinosaurs and practicing writing their name beautifully underneath. Children have been making binoculars to go on a dinosaur hunt. In our Numberblock learning we were learning about number 9 and practicing counting to 9. Our Makaton sign of the



week is happy. For this topic the children have decided they want to learn lots of new dinosaur names and paint some dinosaurs. We are collecting toilet rolls and kitchen roll tubes please for our junk modelling area (as the binoculars were very popular) so would appreciate if you could bring in any from home thanks so much.

#### **RECEPTION**

This week in Reception we have been busy exploring our new topic Splendid Safari. We put on our imaginary binoculars and went on safari down the corridor spotting clues about what we would be learning about. We have also been writing about what we saw in our literacy lessons, using our sentence skills (full stops, capital letters and finger spacing). We are looking forward to starting a new book in Literacy next week all about a Selfish Crocodile. In Themed learning this week we have been learning about the similarities and differences between African life and life where we live. We have begun to explored the different landscapes and wildlife so far.

We have been practicing our pancake tossing in our outdoor area this week and have been making Safari animal small worlds and habitats in the construction area during our busy learning. We have been very excited to explore our new Safari Camp out and Vets role play areas.

#### YEAR ONE

This week, the children have been introduced to our new literacy story 'Daisy Doodles'. They have wrote what they like and dislike about the story and created beautiful story maps to help them remember the structure. In maths, the children have practised measuring the height and length of different objects using items, such as blocks, pencils, footsteps and rulers. In Science, we categorised animals into their groups, whether they were amphibians, reptiles, mammals, birds or fish. In Geography, the children have thought about Cranbrook, how it is changing and what was here before? In RE, the children have learnt about Holy Week and what happened on each day.

#### **YEAR TWO**

We have had a lovely week back in school this week. In Literacy we have started our new book "Grow your own lettuce" and we have planted our own lettuce seeds, focusing on the step-by-step instructions from the book. In Maths we have been working on statistics, putting data into tally charts, box diagrams and pictograms. In PE we are focusing on gymnastics and we are excited to learn more!

#### YEAR THREE

In Year 3 this week we have been looking closely at instruction writing in literacy. The children watched eagerly whilst their teacher made jam sandwiches in front of them, they were then tasked with instructing their teacher on how to remake the sandwich from scratch. As a reward some of the children even got the try apricot jam for the first time and they loved it! In Geography we have been looking at our new topic 'Our food, our world' The children learnt about the process of getting milk from a cow to the supermarket and just how quickly this happens! We are very much looking forward to learning more about where food comes from and the impact this has on farmers and consumers whilst recognising food miles. The children have been given their home learning grids for this half term. Should you have any questions abut this please do let us know. We look forward to welcoming you to parents evening next Tuesday.

#### **YEAR FOUR**

This week Year 4 have been practising for our assembly! Rehearsals have been going well and we are all looking forward to performing to you all on Wednesday! In PE, we had a visitor come in to teach us kickboxing! Everyone thoroughly enjoyed it and we will be doing this every week in PE this term! In Geography, we have started our new topic on Migration. In Maths, we have been continuing with fractions and learning how to simplify them. We look forward to seeing you all for our performance next Wednesday!

#### YEAR FIVE

In Year 5 we have had a great week.

We have started our new PE which is kickboxing, the children were really respectful and listened very well. We have also started our new topic in English 'Wallace and Gromit's Cracking Contraptions' where the children have been learning all about expanded noun phrases, time adverbials and formal and informal writing. We have also started new topics in both Maths and Geography which are 'Fractions' and 'Earths Biomes' which the children seem to be enjoying.

The homework grids have been set and handed out, we were really impressed with the homework we received last term and we are looking forward to receiving more this term.

#### **YEAR SIX**

This week, Year 6 children have been busy continuing their work on algebra in maths. Equations have been solved and formulae written and displayed using the bar model. Our new topic in Geography is rivers so we have been using a map of the UK to locate rivers across Great Britain. In English, our new text is called 'Weslandia' and follows a boy creating his own civilisation. We can't wait to start planning some creative writing based on this excellent text. Science this week has been focused on gravity and there has been plenty of debate and discovery surrounding Sir Isaac Newton's law.


